Changing Lives

Encountering the one true God birthed Isaiah's prophetic ministry

Isaiah 6 is one of my favorite chapters in the Old Testament. While preparing a message from this passage, I was struck by the power of the account of Isaiah's life-changing encounter when He saw the Lord "sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up." Seraphim — six-winged angelic creatures — stood above the throne and cried out, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts." Isaiah was so moved by what he saw that the only response he could muster was:

"Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips." — Isaiah 6:5

The prophet Isaiah was influential and involved in politics. He was highly educated and respected in his circle. But I am sure that even he was brought to his knees and buried his face on the floor during this encounter with our holy God. Even the doorposts were shaking because of the voice of him who cried out declaring the holiness of God. Then one of the seraphim took a live coal from the altar and placed it on Isaiah's mouth. What followed was a great declaration, "Your iniquity is taken away and your sin purged." The prophet was free from sin! Now, there were new opportunities for him to be used of God.

Then Isaiah heard the Lord: "Whom shall I send and who will go for Us?" Isaiah responded, "Here am I! Send me." He was called and commissioned to tell all of Israel that they must repent and turn toward God.

This experience brought about new life-changing direction for Isaiah. Why? Because God had an encounter with a man to show the man who He truly is. Isaiah knew it would not be business as usual going forward. He felt the burden of the people who had wandered away from God and knew his challenge was to bring them into relationship with Him.

Teresa and I feel the same way. God has called us to reach those who do not know Christ. We do that through training pastors to make disciples (fully devoted followers of Christ). We also have established 23 Discipleship Training Centers in multiple cities in Asia to train pastors and people of faith to become fully devoted followers of Christ.

Charles Spurgeon, who has been called the "Prince of Preachers," once said, "No man can do me a truer kindness in this world than to pray for me."

Prayer is vital to the work of the Lord, whether you minister in your own country or abroad in a culture foreign to you. Sometimes planting seeds for a harvest of souls is harder in one's own culture. Consider Jesus, who

was rejected by the people in His hometown. "He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him" (John 1:11).

Although Teresa and I have a local ministry, we have also been called to serve from afar and to support those ministering in their own countries. These friends and ministry partners may have limited financial means or prayer

support as believers are often oppressed or even persecuted in their homeland. I have pastored churches and traveled as an evangelist (and still do at times), but I'm thankful I live at a time when I can teach from my home in Central Florida or use a phone app to reach out to our ministry partners in Asia. Let me close with this important word as we remember to pray for our ministry partners:

"The connection between missions and prayers is inextricable; missionaries should not be serving without spending considerable time in prayers. The Gospels record that Jesus himself before starting His mission on Earth, he spent forty days in fasting and prayers, and later He taught his followers how to pray (Luke 11). In Ephesians 6:17-19 Paul says 'and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints and also for me, that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the gospel.' From the New Testament we see that prayers were a common theme in the life of all the apostles and in their writings. Prayer is a declaration of



our total dependency on God and total trust that He is sovereign" (Source: MissionQuest.org).
